I even saw chocolate Altoid breath mints in the grocery checkout aisle the other day! I think that's what led me to remember the famous quote from Forrest Gump: "Life is like a box of chocolates...you never know what you're gonna get." (I even remembered it with his accent.)

In reality, that phrase can be true in many ways. We wake up every morning completely unsure of what the day may hold for us. We've made our plans. Sometimes they even happen the way we make them. But we never know for sure, do we?

God's Place

Where do we turn? Florida Gulf Coast University's Board of Trustees has voted to accept the state's offer of the land at 5820 Buckingham Road for the University. This is the land Love and Compassion Ministries was trying to acquire from the state to use for God's Place. State law requires that state organizations be given the first chance at this property.

I have written a letter to Bill McCollum, Attorney General Department of Legal Affairs, Alex Sink, Chief Financial Officer Department of Financial Services, Commissioner Charles H. Bronson Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and even a letter to Governor Charlie Crist, asking them to look into Love and Compassion Ministries renting the property for God's Place as laid out more than a year ago.

Our dream has been to make this a facility for the homeless, people with physical, mental, and emotional problems, released juvenile offenders, drug and alcohol addicted, down trodden and hungry people of this area. We plan to teach these people how to grow their own vegetables, prepare the food, and reap the benefits of eating good wholesome food that they had raised. We plan to raise cattle, chickens, and all that is needed to sustain the group without any outside assistance as we teach them a trade, all at no cost to them or the State of Florida.

We prepared a business plan and five year budget for the facility. This has been presented to the governor and his board. Now the governor, attorney general, chief financial officer, and commission of agriculture and consumer services must vote to give the land to FGCU or LCM.

We are praying that with your help and prayers we can convince these people to make the facility available to Love and Compassion Ministries.

If the state allows Love Compassion Ministries to rent the property we will save the taxpayers millions of dollars every year. We will put more than seventy people to work the first year, and more than one hundred and fifty-five people by the fifth year as we serve more than twelve hundred and fifty clients. At this point, I do not believe the University has any specific plans for the use of the property.

We have lost our sensitivity!

Just as a frog will stay in a frying pan... as the pan gets hotter and hotter, he loses his sensitivity to the heat and ends up dying from something that he had the ability all the time to jump out of. Many of us, have lost our sensitivity to how movies, TV, alcohol, drugs, environment, schools, lying and dishonest politicians and abusive people have affect us, just like the frog in the pan. We are compromising our moral values more and more!

The United States is one of the richest countries in the world, yet we have people going without their basic needs being met everyday. Love and Compassion is doing all we can to help these people but the tide is too strong and the resources are drained. The ministry has contacted businesses, Churches, and individuals for help in meeting these needs with very little response. We have sent out letters, taken people out to lunch, met them at our place and at their place with very insignificant reaction.

Nearly one in five Americans said they lacked the money to buy the food needed at some point in the past year, according to a survey co-sponsored by the Gallup organization and released January 26, 2010 by an anti-hunger group. This area is especially hard hit. We see an increasing use of food stamps and a rise in the amount of the food stamps being applied for.

More than 38 million Americans — one in eight — now receive food stamps, which is an all time record high. With over 3000 homeless people in Lee County now. Many of our neighbors have lost their jobs, housing, and the ability to support their families. They don't want the government to give them a check! They want a job where they can support their families and remain independent.

My granddad always said, "charity begins at home." Many Churches send thousands of dollars to foreign countries and yet will do very little to help the people right here in our own back yard. Love And Compassion Ministries wishes to open a facility (God's Place) that will take these people and show them love, compassion, and mercy as we meet their immediate and long term needs. Many of them are very intelligent and are willing to do anything to help their families. We are able to see the potential that lives within each of them.

My heart cries out to God for the many that are in such hardship today and with very little hope for the future. I pray that we will wake up and open our eyes to what is going on around us. We don't need to go to the mission field... the mission field is all around us! We need to spend money here.

We will be able to make a difference in these men, women, and children's lives if we will become sensitive to their needs. Many people will mock us because their hearts have become cold and they are walking after their own lusts. Pray with me that God will transform their hearts.

Won't You Stand With Me! It is more important today, than ever before, to show people that there is hope in Jesus Christ!

May the Lord move you to join with me in impacting this area and the world for the God!
