Text: Genesis 29:15–35

Big Idea: Succumbing to the world's definition of success brings devastation and disappointment, but God works with, through, and in weak people to give satisfaction.

Keywords: Abundant life; Desire; Emptiness; Family; Happiness; Longing; Mothers; Motherhood; Parenting; Satisfaction, Self-worth, Success.

The story of Leah has many facets. Here are a few highlights. It would be good to read the story and then reflect on the following:

The story is an Old Testament love triangle. Leah was caught in a conflict with her sister for the man she loved. Leah was not as beautiful as her sister.

Laban's Plot and Leah's Lot: Jacob came and fell in love with Rachel, but their father Laban wanted Jacob to marry Leah, the first born daughter as was the custom. He tricked Jacob into 7 years of work for Rachel's hand. On the wedding night, a veiled Leah was led into the bridal chamber. There Jacob spent the first night with his bride. The untrustworthy Laban had secretly substituted Leah for Rachel. Jacob asked for Rachel's hand in marriage and worked for 7 more years for her.

Leah was doomed to a loveless marriage. It was an unhappy home. She was despised by her sister Rachel. Leah worked in vain to win her husband's affection. There were many years in Leah's life of jealousy and competition between herself and her sister.

Leah bore Jacob 6 sons. Throughout the story she must have been very unhappy and she could have become bitter. But she continued to love her husband even though that love was not returned. Leah was rewarded. Her six sons became representatives of six of the twelve tribes of Israel. It was through her son Judah's line that the Savior was born.

Why is this story in the Bible? As I see it, the story of Jacob, Rachel and Leah shows that Bible characters were real people who made real mistakes like you and I. But, also like you and I, they were loved by God.

Through Leah we can learn that even in unhappiness and strife we must keep our eyes on the only One who truly loves us and gives us our worth. We make mistakes and fall into temptations, but even when we don't do everything the way God would want it, He sees our heart and will reward our devotion.

Conclusion: We cannot look to anything but Jesus to satisfy our longings; everything on Earth is imperfect and will disappoint us.

Spiritual Famine


*Your word is a lamp

Dear Friends,

One of my favorite stories of the Bible is of Gideon in Judges six, seven, and eight. An angel of the Lord comes to Gideon as he is threshing wheat. We are told that Gideon's clan (family) is the weakest in Manasseh and that he is the least in his father's house, yet our Lord tells him that he is a mighty man of valor and that he would defeat the Midianites as one man (Judges 6:16).

One of the first things that he does is tear down the altar of Baal.

With no chance of defeating the Midianites, Gideon asked God for a sign. And twice God granted Gideon a sign that the Lord was with him. The Lord gave Gideon three hundred men to fight an enemy without number, as the sand on the seashore in multitude. Gideon started out with 32,000 men and as the Lord commanded he went into battle with 300 fearless men.

With God directing their course of action, Gideon and these few men did defeat the Midianites while our Lord received all the glory. Because Gideon was faithful to the calling on his life, our Lord was able to use him in a mighty way.

First Corinthians 1: ²⁶ For ye see your calling, brethren, how that not many wise men after the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called: ²⁷ But God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise; and God hath chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty.

What about us today? Can we be used by our Lord to do mighty things now even though we may be weak? I believe we have such a great and awesome opportunity to reach people for our Lord as so many are in need of a Savior. Many have lost their jobs, houses, and even their families because of financial difficulties. They are in need of help in so many ways, yet many Christians have become stiff-necked waiting on the government or others to help these people.

As we come in contact with all types of people day in and day out, are we willing to tear down the altars of Baal and fight the battle set before us by our Lord and Savior? Our Lord wishes not one to perish, but yet when we miss that opportunity to witness to a person, pray for them, or show them kindness, we have allowed satan to win that battle.

As Christians, we are no more than one beggar telling another beggar where to find bread. None of us are mighty in ourselves. Without Christ we are no more than a lump of dirt with a lot of water.
