Annual Plant a Seed Dinner

We met many of our supporters at our first Annual Plant a Seed Dinner last Friday at First Baptist Church in Fort Myers. They learned more about Love and Compassion Ministries, and we enjoyed spending the evening with them.

Ron Willis introduced Love and Compassion Ministries by describing how we serve the drug addicted, the homeless, the imprisoned, and the needy. He shared our goal of teaching all of these God's grace and love.



Denise Fisher

Denise Fisher shared her testimony. In 2000, she was in the Lee County jail stockade facing a 20 year sentence for drug abuse. One day she saw a man walking by, and she screamed at him, "Hey, I need help." That man was Ron Willis, but he explained to her he was supposed to be working only with the men. She said she needed prayer, so it was okay. Ron prayed with her, and told her he did not think it was the

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Lord's will for her to serve 20 years in prison. To her surprise, on the date she appeared in court, Ron Willis was there to speak for her. She was sentenced to five years. She told Ron she hoped he liked to write, and every week during the next five years, she and Ron wrote one another. Each Christmas Love and Compassion Ministries brought presents to her son and daughter. The gift card always said from "mama".

Today, Denise has been out of prison for about six years, and she has her own business. Denise said, "prayer works", and she encouraged those at the dinner to help Love and Compassion Ministries, so others can know when they yell, "Hey, I need help", LCM will be able.

Pastor James Holbrook

Ron Willis introduced Jim Holbrook, retired pastor of McGregor Baptist Church, as our featured speaker. The board of LCM presented Pastor Holbrook with a plaque recognizing him for his loyal service, enduring friendship, and outstanding generosity to Love and Compassion Ministries.

Upon his retiring from McGregor Baptist Church, Pastor Holbrook started teaching at the Lee County stockade for us. He said Ron did him one of the best of favors when he asked him to start going to the jail.

The Pastor spoke from Psalms 110.



Psalms 110 (kjv)

- 1. The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit thou at my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool.*
- 2. The Lord shall send the rod of thy strength out of Zion: rule thou in the midst of thine enemies.*
- 3. Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power, in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning: thou hast the dew of thy youth.*
- 4. The Lord hath sworn, and will not repent, Thou art a priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek.*
- 5. The Lord at thy right hand shall strike through kings in the day of his wrath.*
- 6. He shall judge among the heathen, he shall fill the places with the dead bodies; he shall wound the heads over*

many countries.

- 7. He shall drink of the brook in the way: therefore shall he lift up the head.*

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This most quoted Psalm tells us that somebody cares about us, and that somebody is Jesus. He cares about us in an impersonal world.

Pastor Holbrook said Jesus is telling us three things:

1. **He is keeping us! vs. 1,2, &4 . He is sitting at the right hand of God as our defense attorney
The Devil is the prosecuting attorney demanding that we pay with the death penalty.
Jesus says, "I already died for that". God says, "Case dismissed!"
Hebrews 10:21 says when I confess to Jesus, He makes it right. He patches it up, and I get to try again.**
2. **He is calling us into His service.
The church is a group of people God is calling to serve Him, but few respond.
We are saved to serve.
Listen! And, be willing if God wants you to do it!**
3. **Jesus is preparing to come back for us. He is coming again to make things right.
He's preparing a place for you and me.
He will present you and me to the Father as His lovely bride. (Rev. 19:7-8)**

The pastor suggested more get aboard with the ministry . He shared how blessed he is to be involved.

Are you praying?” Dr. Phillips with a heavy heart said, “Your lab report came back and it says you have cancer, and Edith, you’re not going to live very long.”

Edith said, “Why Will Phillips, shame on you. Why are you so sad? Do you think God makes mistakes? You have just told me I’m going to see my precious Lord Jesus, my husband, and my friends. You have just told me that I am going to celebrate Easter forever, and here you are having difficulty giving me my ticket.”

Dr. Phillips thought to himself, “What a magnificent woman this Edith Burns is!”

Edith continued coming to Dr. Phillips. Christmas came and the office was closed through January 3rd. On the day the office opened, Edith did not show up. Later that afternoon, Edith called Dr. Phillips and said she would have to be moving her story to the hospital and said, “Will, I’m very near home, so would you make sure they only put women, in my room, who need to know about Easter.” Well, they did just that and many women were saved. Everybody on that floor from staff to patients were so excited about Edith, that they started calling her *Edith Easter*, that is everyone except Phyllis Cross, the head nurse.

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Phyllis made it plain that she wanted nothing to do with Edith because she was a “religious nut.” She had been a nurse in an army hospital. She had seen it all and heard it all. She was the original G.I. Jane. She had been married three times, she was hard, cold, and did everything by the book. One morning the two nurses who were to attend to Edith were sick.

Edith had the flu and Phyllis Cross had to go in and give her a shot. When she walked in, Edith had a big smile on her face and said, “Phyllis, God loves you and I love you, and I have been praying for you.” Phyllis Cross said, “Well, you can quit praying for me, it won’t work. I’m not interested.”

Edith said, “Well, I will pray and I have asked God not to let me go home until you come into the family.” Phyllis Cross said, “Then you will never die because that will never happen,” and curtly walked out of the room.

Every day Phyllis Cross would walk into the room and Edith would say, “God loves you Phyllis and I love you, and I’m praying for you.” One day Phyllis Cross said she was literally drawn to Edith’s room like a magnet would draw iron. She sat down on the bed and Edith said, “I’m so glad you have come, because God told me that today is your special day.” Phyllis Cross said, “Edith, you have asked everybody here the question, “Do you believe in Easter, but you have never asked me.” Edith said, “Phyllis, I wanted too many times, but God told me to wait until you asked, and now that you have asked...” Edith Burns took her Bible and shared with Phyllis Cross the Easter Story of the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Edith said, “Phyllis, do you believe in Easter? Do you believe that Jesus Christ is alive and that He wants to live in your heart?” Phyllis Cross said, “Oh, I want to believe that with all of my heart, and I do want Jesus in my life.” Right there, Phyllis Cross prayed and invited Jesus Christ into her heart. For the first time Phyllis Cross did not walk out of a hospital room, she was carried out on the wings of angels. Happy Easter Phyllis!”

When she walked into Edith’s room, Edith was in bed. That big black Bible was on her lap. Her hands were in that Bible. There was a sweet smile on her face. I go to prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself, that where I am, there you may be also.” Her right hand was on Revelation 21:4, “And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes, there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying; and there shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away.”

Phyllis Cross took one look at that dead body, and then lifted her face toward heaven, and with tears streaming down her cheeks, said, “Happy Easter, Edith -Happy Easter!” Phyllis Cross left Edith’s body, walked out of the room, and over to a table where two student nurses were sitting.

She said, “My name is Phyllis Cross. **Do you believe in Easter?**”

And likewise a Levite, when he was at the place, came and looked on him, and passed by on the other side. ³³. But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was: and when he saw him, he had compassion on him, ³⁴. And went to him, and bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine, and set him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took care of him. ³⁵. And on the morrow when he departed, he took out two pence, and gave them to the host, and said unto him, Take care of him; and whatsoever thou spendest more, when I come again, I will repay thee. ³⁶. Which now of these three, thinkest thou, was neighbour unto him that fell among the thieves? ³⁷. And he said, He that shewed mercy on him. Then said Jesus unto him, Go, and do thou likewise.

Are we willing to pass people by and do nothing? Yes, it may cost you something, but the rewards you receive you will not believe. This country is in a mess. It is time that we reach out to all who are hurting regardless of their faith, race or gender? We need to help them find jobs, housing and transportation. The problem is we don't want to give someone money just for them to drink it up or use it to do drugs. So what are we to do?
